Independent Examiners report to the Trustees on the unaudited financial statements of Dunfermline District & Scottish Transport Regiment Pipe Band.

In accordance with the engagement letter dated 27th November 2015 I compiled the financial statements of the charity which comprises the income and expenditure account, the statement of balance and the related notes from the accounting records and information and explanations you have given me.

My work has been undertaken so that I might compile the financial statements that I have been engaged to compile, report to the charities trustees that I have done so and state those matters that I have agreed to state to them in this report and for no other purpose. I have carried out this engagement in accordance with the technical guidance issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Scotland and have complied with the ethical guidance laid down by the Institute relating to members undertaking the compilation of financial statements.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. The charity trustees consider that the audit requirement of Regulation 10(1) (a) to (c) of the Accounts Regulations do not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as required under Section 44(1) of the act to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of Independent Report

My examination is carried out in accordance with Regulation 11 of the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with these records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts and seeks explanations from the trustees concerning such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit and, consequently, I do not express an opinion on the view given by the trustees.
